


SGT DENTAL COLLEGE, HOSPITAL AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE (FACULTY OF DENTAL SCIENCES) SGT UNIVERSITY, GURUGRAM SGT University Marks World Oral Health Day 2025 with a Month-Long Celebration from 20th March- 20th April 2025. The World Oral Health Day 2025 campaign kicked off with the global theme on 'A Happy Mouth is A Happy Mind' highlights the crucial importance of oral health and its strong connections to overall health.

World Oral Health Day (WOHD) is a global observance day celebrated every year on 20th March with a motive to raise awareness of oral health and prevention of oral diseases. FDI World Dental Federation launched this day in 2013 as a flagship forum to discuss and talk about dental care and oral hygiene all around the world.

SGT Dental College, Hospital and Research Institute, SGT University, Gurugram observed WOHD 2025 with a series of activities on oral health promotion and awareness campaign in collaboration with Indian Association of Public Health Dentistry (IAPHD) mentioned as follows:

- Oral Health Awareness and treatment Camps at Various Outreach Locations- 20th March-20th April 2025- **Total 26 Dental Camps** were conducted during this month.
- New Initiative: Collaboration with Help Age India to conduct dental camps (Proposal Signing Ceremony) on 24th March 2025 following camps with Help Age India on 26th-28th March 2025
- Oral Health Awareness lecture and Free Oral health Checkup for Non-teaching staff of SGT University- 25th March 2025
- WOHD Celebration in Blind School, Lodhi Road, Delhi- 28th March 2025
- Visit to the Primary Health Centre (PHC), Daulatabad by BDS students, featuring interactive skits and community engagement activities. 4th April 2025
- Oral Health Message Signatory Booth- 10th April 2025
- Scientific Competitions- 15th April 2025
- Webinar by Subject Expert (Dr. Harsh Priya)- 18th April 2025



Our outreach efforts successfully reached diverse populations including schoolchildren, rural and urban communities, special needs individuals, particularly children with visual impairments.

The camps featured comprehensive dental check-ups, engaging health talks on the importance of oral hygiene, and demonstrations on the correct use of various oral hygiene aids. Participants received education on the harmful effects of tobacco use, along with personalized oral hygiene instructions. Informational, Educational, and Communication (IEC) materials were distributed to reinforce learning.

To create greater impact, dental students performed interactive skits and street plays, effectively conveying key messages in an engaging manner. All patients were provided on-the-spot treatment through our fully equipped Mobile Dental Van. Those requiring advanced or specialized care were referred to SGT Dental Hospital for further management.

Apart from the outreach activities, In-campus of the University, all the employees (Teaching and Non-teaching) were motivated to come forward for their dental checkup and learn essential oral hygiene routine during the WOHD month. Dental faculty members, Postgraduate students and undergraduates of the faculty were all involved in these activities to make World Oral Health Day 2025 a huge success.












2. Name of activity: Academic cum Field Visit to Primary Health Centre (PHC) Visit, Daultabad, Haryana.

SLOGAN WRITING COMPETITION




• Patient Counselling Video Competition













4. Name of activity: WEBINAR BY SUBJECT EXPERT




Brief Description:















5. Name of activity: ORAL HEALTH MESSAGE SIGNATURE BOOTH



Brief Description:



BLIND SCHOOL CENTRE, LODHI ROAD, NEW DELHI

As part of the World Oral Health Month- long activities organized by Dept. of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University, a comprehensive dental screening and treatment program was conducted at the Blind Relief Association, New Delhi on 27th March to 20th 20th April 2025 to assess the oral health status of visually impaired children. The activity aimed to identify dental issues, provide early interventions, and empower children with knowledge for maintaining optimal oral hygiene.

To create awareness among them, dental awareness talk was delivered, educating students about common dental ailments. Tooth brushing technique was demonstrated using dentoform model and students were made to practice the same. Each student was assisted by the dental team members during self-practice toothbrushing session.

An educational cum fun activities (interactive session on oral health, Quiz, Poem recitation) for the school students and vocational trainees. The program conducted at the Blind Relief Association during the World Oral Health Month activities served as a critical step in assessing the oral health needs of visually impaired children. By identifying dental issues, providing personalized recommendations, and promoting preventive interventions, the screening contributed to advancing the oral health outcomes of its participants. Moving forward, ongoing efforts to prioritize oral health education and accessible dental care are essential for ensuring the well-being of visually impaired individuals and fostering inclusive healthcare practices.

Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s) explaining activities undertaken: The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University in collaboration with Reliance MET organized a dental as well as medical camp on 20th March 2025 at Village Yakubpur, Jhajjar to celebrate World Oral Health Day, 2025. A total of 62 patients including 20 males and 42 females were examined. Of which 15 patients were treated in mobile dental van at camp location. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT Dental Hospital for further procedures. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated using posters. Oral hygiene kits were distributed to patients. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated the check up and patient care provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health.

Objective of the Activity:

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University in collaboration with Publicity team organized a dental as well as medical camp on 22nd March, 2025 at Ateli, Haryana.

The dental team took initiative under guidance of Dr. Charu Khurana (Associate Prof. and Head, Public Health Dentistry). The dental team was headed by Dr. Rangoli Srivastava (Senior Lecturer, Dept. of Public Health Dentistry) along with 2 postgraduates Dr.Swati (Oral Surgery), Dr.Vaishnavi (PG, Endodontist) and 5 interns – Tara, Parul, Tanya, Jyoti, Abhishek along with 1 attendant Mr.Sunil accompanied us. Dental checkup of 64 adults and children were done.

On account of celebration of World Oral Health Day, emphasis was done on motivating patients to maintain good oral hygiene. Toothpaste and toothbrushes were distributed among the patients on account of the same purpose. Those who required treatment were given treatment like oral prophylaxis, restorations, extractions. Radiograph was taken for patients who required investigations.

Positive feedback was obtained from participants. Cases requiring complex treatment were referred to SGT Dental College. All patients were given referral slips. The children and adults got ample opportunities to interact with the dental surgeons to enquire and gain knowledge concerning oral diseases. Necessary oral hygiene instructions were given to required adults and children.

The importance of maintaining good and hygienic oral health was verbally delivered to the children and adults.

With the involvement of every single member of the dental team and their enormous efforts, the motive of the dental camp was achieved to its maximum.
